### BRITISH VALUES – MUTUAL RESPECT

Here are examples of how the British Value of mutual respect is taught at Sneyd Green Primary School. It is not exhaustive and does not capture all learning in this area.

YEAR GROUP	SUBJECT	CONTENT
Nursery	Understanding of the World, PSED, People and communities	Children are actively taught to share and take turns in activities. They are also taught empathy for others. Topic work on Feelings in PSED during the Autumn term gives children an opportunity to express their feelings in a range of situations.
Reception	Understanding of the World, PSED, People and communities	Children regularly have circle time to discuss their feelings about issues. They are actively taught to follow golden rules which are based on respect of themselves, each other and property.
Year 1	PSHE, Autumn Term and Summer Term	Children are taught about the school values and expectations which begins with Show respect. PSHE lessons in the summer term teach children how to care for a family member and pets.
Year 2	RE Science, Summer Term	RE curriculum encourages children to respect different faiths and their teachings. Children learn about animals, plants and the environment and how to care for it.
Year 3	PSHE, Autumn Term RE, Autumn Term	Children explore issues about friendships and relationships.
Year 4	PSHE, English, History, PE, RE	Children encouraged to work co-operatively in groups to complete tasks. Activities foster discussions which ensure that children need to understand that other children may have views which differ from their own.
Year 5	PSHE, Autumn Term	Children are taught about aspects of friendship including: *types of relationships *understanding how everyone is different
Year 6	PSHE, Autumn and Spring Term	PSHE teaching during the Autumn and Spring Term covers bullying, getting on and falling out, me and others and choices. These lessons are all based on respect.
General	Assemblies  School Values School Rules  Theme weeks eg anti bullying week	Assemblies revisit the theme of respect on a regular basis. Children encouraged to understand what respect is, how we show it and earn it. Also how respect can be lost. Respect is a school value. It is in the general ethos of the school. The first of our SAFE expectations is Show respect. Children receive sanctions for not following this expectation. Children are taught about how to keep each other and themselves safe and to promote positive emotional wellbeing.
